# Hello

We would just like to introduce ourselves. We are James and Lin Jones and we live just down the road from the properties with our three children. Ceri, Rhys and Sian. The farmhouse was a family home for Llewelyn (James's dad.) Llew is still an active member of the farming team and helps out with the gardening at the properties and is probably fitter than us all. We started doing holiday lets in the farmhouse in 2014. At the end of 2017 we converted the barns and the glamping pods arrived in 2021 as people seemed to enjoy visiting this part of the world.





Our 400 + acre farm is mainly beef and sheep. We have about 1200 ewes and 70 cows. Our mark is the green on the side of the sheep. Lambing is our busiest time and we lamb outdoors so you may well see some lambs being born if you are lucky enough during March and April. During the summer months. the tractors take on most of the work harvesting the fields bringing in the crops for winter. Winter can be the most challenging time dependant on the weather as the stock need attending to whatever the weather, even Christmas day.

We hope you enjoy exploring the farm but please be mindful of the livestock and machinery.

# WHAT YOU DON'T NEED TO PACK

### STARTER PACK OF ESSENTIALS



Toilet roll, washing up liquid, hand wash, bin bags, salt, pepper, cooking oil, tea, coffee and semi-skimmed milk are all provided. You may need to bring more for longer stays.



### BOTTLED WATER

We are lucky enough to have a natural source of water so you don't need to pack big bulky bottles of water.





All major supermarkets deliver to the accommodation so if you want to save space and hassle, get a delivery. Just remember to change the address from your home.



### LINEN AND TOWELS

All linen is washed at 60 degrees, tumble dried and ironed in house. 1 bath sheet and hand towel per guest. Robes are supplied in the pods.

# WHAT YOU DO NEED TO PACK



### STURDY WATERPROOF FOOTWEAR

To take advantage of the walks and surrounding attractions, good footwear will ensure your not coming home with wet soggy feet.



### SWIM STUFF

Remember all properties have a hot tub so don't forget your swimwear and a separate hot tub towel would be useful.



### TOOTHBRUSH

Don't panic if you do forget, we do have an honesty shop in the farmhouse and barns with essentials you may have forgotten to bring.



### FOOD

If you don't want a delivery, we are 20-30 minutes from a supermarket so I advise bringing your food from home or stop on the way to save having to go back out again as soon as you arrive.



### CLOTHES

This is one thing we can't really help with but be prepared for all weathers- we can have sunshine, rain and even snow in a day during the colder months!

# WALKS FROM THE DOORSTEP

### CIRCULAR WALK-45 MINUTE WALK

This 45 minute walk is our most popular with guests. A gentle climb up along the track that leads to to the top of the hill where breathtaking views await you. Manageable in trainers in dry seasons but sturdy footeasr is recommended as it is a bit uneven.

### **SOLDIERS TUMP-2 HOUR WALK**

This walk takes you to the trigg point which is just under 1800 ft above sea level and is a bit more challenging however our children have done this walk many times. The 360 degree views from the top on a clear day are unrivaled.

### BEGUILDY VILLAGE- 1 ½ HOUR WALK

This walk takes you over fields, onto the beacon and along a tarmac road to the local village where you will you find the local post office and shop and pub. A nice downhill stretch to the village but after a meal and a pint maybe more challenging coming home. If you want to walk for a meal and get a lift home, we will help out if we can - just get in touch.

## **Devils bridge falls Devil's bridge, Pontarfynach, SY23 3JW**

Nature trail, Waterfalls and 3 bridges long walk or take the punchbowl and 3 bridges walk, a shorter walk with 220 slate steps. You can then continue by steam train to Aberystwyth seaside town (seperate attraction)

## Towns to Visit



**KNIGHTON** 

Our closest town, 13 miles from Maesgwyn Holiday Lets. Here you'll find our favourite Chinese and Indian takeaway. The fish and chip shop and kebab shop are also popular. **NEWTOWN**

### A YEAR ON OUR FARM

Spring

Spring- this is when the baby lambs start to appear in the fields. We start lambing mid March until early May. Lowland ewes ideally have two lambs however the upland ewes we only want them to have one as they have to deal with harsher conditions. Most of our lambs are born outside but if the weather is particularly bad, we bring them in during the night to give them a fighting chance. We have a system where the youngest lambs and most expectant mothers are closer to the farmyard so they're easier to keep an eye on. We do have to watch out for foxes, ravens and crows who are their biggest predators. James, Llew and Rhys can often be seen driving the quads around the fields checking on everything and who knows you maybe lucky enough to see them assisting a birth. The cows have their calves all year round.







May and June is when the sheep have their annual haircuts. We shear most ourselves however we do get contractors in to do a couple of big days to make the task less daunting. A contractor can shear up to 300 a day but James is more like 100! This is essential to keep maggots away and keep the sheep healthy. The wool is sent to the wool board but has very little value anymore. Look out for the bluebells that come out at this time and create a purple blanket over patches of the land around the farm.

Summer

June and July is when the big machinery have their outing. James mows and bales the grass and Llew follows behind with the wrapper. We don't make any hay as the weather is so unpredictable. We aim to have all the harvest in before the Royal Welsh Show in Mid July. They work long hours often into the night to get it done if there's a spell of dry weather. The purple heather comes out on the beacon and my favourite time to do the soldiers tump walk.

### A YEAR ON OUR FARM

# autumn

Autumn. This is sale season. A lot of the lambs are sold and new tups (male sheep) are bought ready for tupping season. The sheep all have their health checks making sure they're in top condition for when the time comes. The cows usually go inside late October early November depending on the weather as when it get too wet they make a huge mess in the fields. The trees turn a splendid colour full of oranges and yellows. My favourite time to do the circular walk.







# Winter





Winter - usually the most challenging due to the weather but also very pretty when we have a dusting of snow. All the stock need feeding every day - including Christmas Day. Our sheep on the hill opposite the accommodation get fed early mornings to encourage them to stay on our part of the hill, you may see the tractor if you're up early

enough
